
Official Launch of the RealiseD Project

On January 9-10, 2025, the launch of the RealiseD IHI Project marked a significant milestone for clinical trials in rare and ultra-rare diseases. EpiCARE, involved in key areas of the project (WP2, WP3 and WP11), traveled to Vienna (Austria) to attend the RealiseD kick-off meeting at Sigmund Freud University. Over 300 million people worldwide, including 30 million in Europe, live with a rare disease. Most of these are ultra-rare and have no treatment options. The RealiseD IHI project is here to change that. This European public-private partnership formed by nearly 40 partners, is on a mission to optimise and accelerate the development of treatments for rare and ultra-rare conditions.



"Beyond Seizures: Advancing Holistic Care for Rare and Complex Epilepsies" Workshop (26-27th May 2025 – Alesund, Norway)

This workshop focuses on the **challenges beyond seizure control**, including neurodevelopmental, cognitive, mental health, and quality-of-life impacts.
